## The Light of Easter Day

Welcome! Our service begins with the traditional lighting of the Easter Paschal Candle. Please join us in the Parish Centre after the service for refreshments and make some time to get to know each other.

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ. **Alleluia!** 

The minister places the nails in the Paschal Candle, saying these words:

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, the Alpha and the Omega, all time belongs to him, and all ages; to him be glory and power, through every age and forever. Amen. By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard and keep us. **Amen.** 

The Paschal Candle is lit and these words are said:

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds. The light of Christ.

Thanks be to God.

The Paschal Candle is processed into the church while this hymn is sung:

The Paschal Candle is placed on a stand in the midst of the church. At the end of the hymn the service continues in the yellow books.

### The Renewal of Baptismal Vows

Jesus died and rose again at the time of the Passover festival in order to fulfil its meaning: a crossing over. The ancient Jews crossed over from a life of slavery to the land of promise; Jesus crossed over from death to life. We cross over from the slavery and death of sin to the freedom and life of Christ.

That is the meaning of our baptism. Let us who are baptised make an act of unity with the crucified and risen Christ, so that this becomes the pattern of our lives. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask these questions:

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

I come to Christ.

And now I ask you to make the profession of Christian faith into which you were baptized, and in which you live and grow.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world? I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.

We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Almighty God, we thank you for our fellowship in the household of faith with all those who have been baptized in your name. We pray that you may keep us all faithful to our baptism; making us ready for that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**
